Educate Together

Harcourt Terrace Educate Together National School has been established under the patronage of Educate Together. Educate Together runs schools that guarantee equality of access and esteem to children "irrespective of their social, cultural or religious background", are learner centred in their approach to education and are run as participatory democracies, with respectful partnership between parents, pupils, and staff.

Educate Together schools are guided by four main principles. They are:

Child-centred

Our school aims to create a learning environment that nurtures and encourages all children so that they may explore their full range of abilities and reach their highest potential. Children in our school have a right to have their voice and opinions heard and decisions in our school are always taken in the best interests of the children.

Equality-based

The Educate Together school model is based on equality and human rights. Educate Together schools provide a learning environment that is safe and supportive of the identity of every child.

Co-educational

The school is open to boys and girls on an equal basis. Every effort is made to avoid and challenge gender stereotyping both in attitude and teaching materials.

Democratically run

The school is run by management committees that are democratically elected and run and the involvement of parents is sought and encouraged. Children will contribute to school management throughout their time in our school through a variety of platforms such as student council, green schools, and playground committees.

Contacting the school

It is important for you, and for your child that we keep in regular contact in regard to your child's experiences at Harcourt Terrace ETNS. If you have any queries, worries or concerns, or, if you need to inform us of something important, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Our secretary, Molly, works from 8.30am-2:30pm, so outside of these times, we might be slower responding!



School - Home Messages

We are a Green School and communicate with parents' principally through email and from time to time, we may communicate via text. Please ensure the school has your most up to date contact information and let us know if your details change during the year.

The school will issue regular newsletters to keep parents informed of school activities, achievements and exciting news. These will be sent via email from our Aladdin Schools database system. We use **Aladdin Connect** which allows all parents will be able to communicate with us through the APP on your smartphone. We will send out log-in details on our return to school at the end of August.



Absences

It is not necessary to ring the school if your child is absent, however, <u>all absences must be explained via Aladdin</u>

<u>Connect on the day your child returns to school.</u> As a school we abide by the Education and Welfare Act 2000.

Under this act we are obliged to report absences that exceed 20 days in one school year. We also mark children as being late if they are present in school <u>10 minutes after our 8:30AM</u> start time. We encourage all children to be in school at 8:30AM to minimize any loss in teaching time.



Encouraging Healthy Eating

We encourage all children to bring healthy lunches to school each day. Parents and guardians are asked not to send in crisps, bars, cakes, sweets, fizzy drinks, biscuits or chocolate in lunchboxes during the week. It is essential to be mindful of children in the school who have a nut & sesame seed allergies so **please do not include any nuts in your child's lunch**. We are a nut free school. Under the discretion of the school principal, there may be events where treats are allowed to be brought into school. In these cases, parents will be informed in advance. Due to Covid-19 as well as prevention of allergies we do not accept food in from home to share with other children in the class. Children are welcome to drink water whenever they need it during the school day. However, other drinks (juice etc.) are only permitted at break times.

Lunch Boxes and Bottles

Let's teach the children the importance of recycling and please only give them re- usable containers and bottles for lunch.



Birthday parties

Birthdays are so important for children, but we do not celebrate birthday parties in our school. We will treat it as a special day and celebrate it in the class. We will make a fuss! But children are not allowed to bring in cakes or hand out invitations. This is due to allergies which means we cannot share food. It also alleviates the pressure that hosting a party can bring for families.



Positive Behaviour

Our school is a restorative practice school.

This means that we strive to build positive relationships, working to solve conflict together. Our staff have undergone training in restorative practice and promoting positive behaviour. We are currently building this into our daily practice as part of our Code of behaviour. This approach to living and learning ensures that our school is inclusive, calm, and built on a strong sense of responsibility and community.



Child Protection

The school operates a Child Protection Policy under the Children First Guidelines. Anyone with concerns about the welfare of children should report directly to the Designated Liaison Person (DLP).

Health and Safety

As the school grows, we will always endeavour to ensure the school is a safe place for all who attend, visit or work here. If you have any concerns in relation to Health and Safety, please report them to Tony or Sophie (Deputy Principal).



Schoolbooks Grant

The cost of preparing children for school each year can be a challenging and worrying time for many families who are under increased financial pressure. The Department of Education and Skills have setup a grant scheme for all primary school children in Ireland, covering any costs related to schoolbooks, copybooks and workbooks. The school will be providing all stationary materials for children in all classes. Your school fees cover all additional costs for this.



Book Rental

The book rental scheme will provide books that can be reused in the school. Examples of these books are the reading books that the children use. These will be levelled readers such as Oxford Reading Tree, Engage readers, PM readers and the class core readers from the Starlight programme (Folens). We ask that the children take good care of these books when they take them home as part of their homework. The children must ensure their rented books remain in their folder while they are in their schoolbag.

One of our golden rules is:

- · We only ask that your child brings a **schoolbag, pencil case, coat, lunchbox and drink** with them to school each day.






We also have developed partnerships with some local organisations who provide sporting opportunities as part of our PE programme in the school. St. Kevin's GAA Club and Ranelagh Gaels GAA Club provide GAA coaching throughout the year. Leinster Rugby have recently come on board to provide rugby coaching. Our senior classes will go swimming at Swan Leisure Centre every year. As well as that we use the fantastic sporting facilities in Swan Leisure when needed. The children in our school get to avail of some great opportunities locally!



After-school club at Harcourt Terrace ETNS

We have a full-time afterschool programme on our school site in Harcourt Terrace ETNS, which takes place when classes finish and continues up to 6.30pm daily. Your child can unwind in a relaxed, safe and fun, home from home environment which is part of the school community. This programme is run by Kids Inc. and plays an important role in the social and emotional development of our children. It is not intended to be an extension of our school day. Everything is child led and there are a wide range of creative and physical activities that children can tap into throughout the afternoon. Kids Inc. offer homework supervision, which is a big plus for parents and children, as it allows for a more relaxed end to the day for all. 


Our New School Building


We will move to our new permanent home at Harcourt Terrace in September for the 2024/2025 academic year:




HARCOURT TERRACE EDUCATE TOGETHER NATIONAL SCHOOL

- Single storey Special Educational Needs Unit






FIRST FLOOR PLAN

The school is entered from the northern end of the site off Harcourt Terrace.






2. GP Hall (competition image)

The general purpose hall is located in basement level at the northern end of the site. It can be accessed from two levels via the entrance space, and from the main play space via an amphitheatre allowing it to function as a covered play space.

When Your Child Starts School On the first day:

- Have everything ready the night before to reduce last minute panic (e.g., school bag packed, clothes out, plan for breakfast).
- Leave plenty of time so you arrive a few minutes before school starts at **8.30am**. This will help you and your child arrive to school relaxed.
- Reassure your child and talk about the fun they will have in school.
- Try not to let your child see if you are upset and don't hang around for too long on the first morning as this could unsettle your child.
- Make sure your child knows who will be collecting them and where.



Going forward:

- If you have any concerns about your child, contact the school immediately (do not wait!). We use Aladdin Connect for all communication in Harcourt Terrace ETNS. You can also arrange a meeting with the teacher through our school secretary Lori.
- Attend coffee mornings and other PGTA events. There you will learn more about us, and what you can do to support your child at home and to meet other parents.
- Arrange for your child to arrive and be collected on time. This may involve changing your daily schedule
 if you work or seeking support from family members/ friends

Top Tips to Develop Your Child's Skills for school:

The more your child practices relevant skills at home the more he/she will be prepared to participate in real world situations in school. Try to introduce these skills naturally during your child's day at home.

- Encourage self-care skills and independence: Washing hands, putting on their coat, putting on their shoes (Velcro shoes please) putting things into their bag.
- Develop gross motor skills (using big muscles in the body): Pulling & pushing things, sports activities,
 obstacle courses.
- Develop fine motor skills (using small muscles in the hands): Scissors activities, colouring, writing, lego, playdough, clothes pegs.
- Develop their communication skills: Listening games, develop conversations with your child.
- Read with your child: Regular access to reading material as part of the daily routine.
- Play with your child: Develop their imagination through playful activities.



School Times

We believe the best introduction for your child is to stagger them in over a 2-week period to get used to the longer day from pre-school/home-schooling.
